




Age Restrictions on Social Media

P3 - Overview of planned work for December

Mathematics

- Counting in 1s, 2s, 3s 5s &10s, numbers before, after and between up to 100
- Adding a single digit number to a double digit up to 100
- Adding 2/3 numbers horizontally and vertically.
- Read and spell number names to 20
- Recognition of coins and their value
- Introduction to place value of teen numbers.
- Use coins for simple shopping activities up to 20p and giving change.
- Word problems relating to money. Parents are encouraged to engage children in real everyday shopping activities.
- look at units of measurement using cm and metres

Literacy: Pupils will learn how to lay out and write their own letter to Santa, sequence and write a recount of the story of Christmas, complete comprehensions related to the Christmas theme and write instructions on how to make a Christmas decoration. They will complete seasonal acrostic poems. Grammar work will continue to focus on capital letters and full stops, speech marks, question marks & adding 'ing' to a word. We will also look at a variety of stories and poems related to Christmas.

W.A.U.

- Exploration of light and uses (in relation to Christmas lights and decorations) Children will investigate how the earth moves round the sun to make day and night.
- Exploring Christmas traditions around the world.
- Children will design their own decorations

P4 - Overview of planned work for December

Literacy: Pupils will know that adverbs are used to describe verbs. They will identify and use these in their written work and play games about adverbs. Continue to complete the LCSWC method for spellings. Pupils will be reading their shared text, Hurricane and picture book, Flood and will be carrying out activities based on these. In writing pupils will be learning about adventure stories and will be writing their own story based on the book The Tunnel.

Numeracy: Pupils will be continuing to learn their multiplication tables focusing on their 3 times tables and revising their 2, 5 & 10 times tables. Pupils will be solving word problems. Pupils will begin to multiply 2 digit numbers by 1 digit. Our topic work this month will cover time where we will be revising the times of o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Pupils will be writing these in both analogue and digital. They will look at times to 5 minute intervals. We will be solving word problems related to time.

World Around Us: Pupils will continue the topic of Extreme Earth. Pupils will look at the history of Pompeii. Pupils will know what causes earthquakes and how they are measured. Pupils will make their own volcanoes in groups and will construct "earthquake resistant" buildings to withstand their own simulated earthquake. Pupils will create tornado pictures.

P5 - Overview of Planned work for December

Numeracy:

- Number: Language of multiplication and division. Multiplying work (by 2, 3, 4, 5, & 10)
- Topic: Position, movement and angle (grid references, coordinates and compass points)
- Mental Maths Multiplication of tables. Language of multiplication and division
- Weekly tables test and mental maths test preparation
- Learn rule for finding coordinates 'Over the hall and up the stairs'
- Learn rule for compass points 'Naughty elephants squirt water' (N, E, S, W)

Literacy:

- Novel: Complete Charlotte's Web Novel and related activities
- Grammar work: Past tense work and revision of work covered to date
- Writing: Narrative writing Retelling a story in their own words and creating an advertisement
- We will complete spelling list 11 13 from Schofield & Sims Spelling Programme. Christmas spelling words
- Weekly spelling test preparation

Topic work - Complete all work on plants and finish carrying out plant investigations

P6 - Overview of Planned work for December

Maths

Number (Subtraction work to be completed)

Pupils will be able to:

- Solve problems involving addition and subtraction.
- Know 2-12 times tables (Group appropriate) and use these in solving simple problems.

TOPIC

(Symmetry work to be completed)

- Pupils will understand the term Area and be-able to work out areas of 2d shapes (regular and irregular) counting squares/ formula (cm2).
- The pupils will know that the area of square/rectangle (LxB)
- Pupils will know area of a triangle is LxB divided by 2

English

(Adjectives work to be completed)

- Pupils will understand use of speech marks and use them appropriately.
- Pupils will understand the difference between direct and reported speech.
- Pupils will know the key elements of a recount and be able to write one.
- Pupils will write a story in the first person Nativity story.

Topic/World Around Us

- Pupils will complete space powerpoints.
- Pupils will know the planets in our system.
- They will know what a constellation is and be aware of the legends connected with them.

We encourage the P6s to keep AR reading and Mathletics activities going alongside their daily homework. Also they will continue to complete one 'Take Away' homework each week.

The library is open for P6s on Tuesday and Friday Mornings from 8.15am. The ICT suite is available from 8:15 am each morning for pupils to complete AR tests.

The P6 pupils will be having a trip to the Armagh Planetarium on Wednesday 10th January. More information will follow.

- Times tables from 1-12

Literacv:

- Children will read and complete work on 'A Christmas Carol'
- Children will be begin looking at different types of poetry

• We will complete the Famine topic.
