In our ICT lessons P4 have been working on coding using Rainforest Coding. This



The children have also been learning about the features of

P3 overview of planned work for April

Mathematics: Depending on group children will continue work on:

- multiplication of 2s, 5s, and 10s and introduce dividing or sharing
- place value of H.T.U. and T.U. bridging and not bridging the ten
- vertical addition of 2 digit numbers e.g. 21+ 33=
- using the 100 square to explore patterns and quick methods of adding (+9) (+11)

Topic Work:

Money - finding the cost and giving change within 20p/99p

Measures - Capacity using standard measures e.g.: litres and ml

Literacv:

Continue our theme of traditional/fairy tales. Introduce our new author for term three, Roald Dahl, and begin our class novel **Fantastic Mr Fox.** A range of activities related to both including cloze procedure, diary writing, narrative writing. Continue work on verbs –adding ed and ing,

The World Around Us:

- Observations of signs of Spring, mother and baby animals, life cycles of the frog.
- Continue our Great Science stories Miners Lamp and Dinosaur Discovery
- Investigation of materials and their properties.

P4 overview of planned work for April

<u>Literacy-</u> Pupils will continue to learn their spellings using the LSCWC method and will complete various activities to reinforce the spelling rules. Pupils will be reading their class novel, 'Danny the Champion of the World.' In grammar pupils will look at homophones, synonyms, antonyms, colons and commas in lists. We will be writing a play script based on the Three Little Pigs.

<u>Numeracy-</u> Pupils will be learning about division and will be solving word problems. They will continue to learn multiplication facts. We will be looking at fractions of objects and fractions of numbers. Our topic work this month will cover handling data where we will be looking at Venn diagrams and Carroll diagrams. We will be reading scales and giving change with money. Pupils will also use ISAK9 and complete problem solving investigations.

<u>World Around Us-</u> This month we will be introducing our new topic of Buildings. Pupils will look at homes in Victorian times and will be able to name different types of houses e.g. detached, terraced etc. Pupils will look at the work of LS Lowry and complete pictures using perspective and collages. Pupils will learn about the Great Fire of London and the diary of Samuel Pepys. Pupils will look at budgets linking to numeracy. They will write a for sale or for rent poster. Pupils will begin their Stop Motion animations in ICT.

Number: Continuation of fractions. Decimals- recognise,

Weekly tables test, revise all tables learned to date


Parents: Could you encourage children to handle money at home and in real life situations. Revise conversion table

<u>Literacy</u>

Novel: Start new novel 'James and the Giant Peach'

Grammar work: More advanced punctuation, commas and exclamation marks, revision of apostrophes

Writing: Narrative (story) writing – looking in more detail at how a narrative story is made up of, build up, problem and resolution



We will complete spelling list 23, 24, start topic words from 'Schofield & Sims' and matching activities from workbook. Weekly spelling test preparation.

Parents: Could you encourage children to read their Accelerated Reading Books and complete two or more quizzes before Friday.

World Around Us

- Continuation of 'Water' topic Uses of water, saving water in school and home, states of water, water cycle in a bag, terms: evaporation, condensation, precipitation etc.
- Water experiments related to the above topics

Other Information - Work, Trips, Visits etc.

- 10/15 minutes Accelerated reading (AR) /Doodle Maths every night
- Homework Diary signed every night
- Takeaway homework to be handed in by Thursday and a high standard is needed from all children

P6 overview of planned work for April

Maths: Pupils will be working on fractions (moving on to decimals and percentages). They will also be introduced to prime, cube and square numbers.

Topic - Pupils will be working on data handling activities, 12 hour and 24 hour time.

English: Pupils will know when to use apostrophes for contractions and to show possession. Written activities will focus on persuasive writing.

Topic/World Around Us:

Pupils will continue their work on the Vikings. They will learn about Viking Raids, villages, clothes and Viking Gods. All P6 pupils have completed their Viking Trips to Enniskillen Castle which was a great day out.

AR reading: Pupils should be working towards their term 2 word count targets. (if they have not yet achieved this already). Also, congratulations to our newest P6 Millionaires.

Homework

We encourage the P6's to keep doing AR reading and Doodle Maths, which is part of their daily homework.

Please note: this month pupils will not be doing 'Take Away Homework' but will complete a written Numeracy or **Literacy homework each evening** as a reinforcement of work completed in class.

Each pupil should be taking at least one AR test per week (more if on green and orange level) and working towards their word count target for the term.

- **AR Books** can be changed in the library between 8.30 and 8.50.
- **ICT suite** is also available at these times to complete AR tests.
