Baking The P3 classes have been reading the Little Red Hen. They had great fun baking and eating their own bread.













P7 enjoy a trip to the Ulster American Folk Park P7 classes visited the Ulster American Folk park as part of their Famine topic.




P5 Seamus Heaney P5 classes have been learning

about Seamus Heaney's poetry in class this term. They went on a trip to Heaney's home place in Bellaghy to get a greater insight into his life. The children took part in a poetry workshop where they completed challenges linked to onomatopoeia, alliteration, sibilance and rhyming. In groups they wrote poems which they read back to their peers in the auditorium. The children went on a tour of the gallery, using audio sets they were able to listen to Seamus Heaney





reading his poems. Hearing the poets voice really brought the exhibition to life. The children saw pictures of Heaney and his family and read stories about his life. They then competed a 'Rhythm Workshop' where they played word making games and an Imagination and Inspiration workshop where they looked at pictures and objects that influenced Heaney's poems. Heaney said in an interview "I learned what inspiration feels like but not how to summon it... I learned that waiting is part of the work.' At the end of the visit the children took part in a creative art workshop. This was a wonderful and memorable day out for all

Overviews for December

Primary 3

Mathematics:

- Counting in 1s, 2s, 3s, 5s, 10s and numbers before, after and between up to 100; Adding a single digit number to a double digit up to 100; Adding 2/3 numbers horizontally and vertically; Read and spell number names to 20;
- Recognition of coins and their value; Place value of teen numbers; Use coins for simple shopping activities up to £1 / give change to 20p; Word problems relating to money. Parents are encouraged to engage children in real everyday shopping activities.
- Name and identify the properties of 2D shapes

Literacy

🔻 Pupils will learn how to lay out and write their own letter to Santa, they will sequence and write a recount of the story of Christmas. They will complete comprehensions related to the Christmas theme and write instructions on how to make a Christmas decoration. Grammar work will continue to focus on capital letters and full stops, speech 👣 marks, question marks and adding 'ing' to a word. We will also look at a variety of stories and poems related to Christmas.

W.A.U.

- Exploration of light and its uses (in relation to Christmas lights and decorations)
- Design Christmas decoration using clay -Make our own moving Rudolph

• Look at and discuss Christmas traditions

Primary 4

<u>Literacy-</u> Pupils will know that adverbs are used to describe verbs. They will identify and use these in their written work and play games about adverbs. Continue to complete the LCSWC method for spellings. Pupils will read their shared text 'Hurricane' and picture book 'Flood' and will carry out activities based on these. In writing pupils will learn about adventure stories and will write their own story based on the book 'The Tunnel'.

Numeracy-Pupils will continue to learn their multiplication tables focusing on their 3 times tables and revising their 2,5 & 10 times tables. Pupils will solve word problems. Pupils will begin to multiply 2 digit numbers by 1 digit. Our topic work this month will cover 'Time' where we will be revising the times of o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Pupils will write these in both analogue and digital format. They will look at times in 5 minute intervals. We will be solving word problems related to time.

<u>World Around Us-</u> Pupils will continue the topic of Extreme Earth. Pupils will know what causes earthquakes and how they are measured. Pupils will conduct volcano and rainbow experiments. Pupils will know what Tsunamis are and will create safety posters. Pupils will carry out Christmas art and craft activities.

Primary 5

Numeracy

Number: Language of multiplication and division. Multiplying work/activities (by 2, 3, 4, 5, & 10)

Topic: Position, movement and angles (children will be able to read grid references, co-ordinates and compass points).

Mental Maths: Multiplication of tables. Language of multiplication and division.

- Weekly tables test and mental maths test preparation
- Learn rule for finding coordinates 'Over the hall and up the stairs'
- Learn rule for compass points 'Naughty elephants squirt water' (N, E, S, W)

Literacy

Novel: Complete 'Charlotte's Web' novel and related activities. Complete book review.

Grammar work: Past tense work and revision of work covered to date. Proof reading exercises.

Writing: Narrative writing - Retelling a story in their own words and creating an advertisement

- We will complete spellings from Schofield & Sims Spelling Programme and Christmas spelling words
- Weekly spelling test preparation

World Around Us

Topic work on Enniskillen – Learning about the history of St. Michael's Church and the Convent of Mercy, look at all the bridges in Enniskillen. STEM activities (building bridges).

- Sign diary when checking homework activities Week 1 (Literacy), Week 2 (Numeracy), Week 3 (World Around
 Us), Week 4 (Religion, P.D.M.U). Spellings/tables/reading and M/A to be completed every night
- 10 minutes Accelerated reading every night- 2 quizzes per week (Children can go to library/computer suite in morning from 8.30 a.m. 8.45 a.m. to get/change books and complete quizzes. They need to choose one big book and one smaller one on their level. Quizes can be completed on books read every week.
- Bring instrument into school every Wednesday (Keep safe at home please) Use of 'Charanga Music Programme' at home (Passwords given to all children)
- Highlight important information or signs in Mental Arithmetic work. Complete corrections

Primary 6

<u>Maths</u> Number- Pupils will be able to solve problems involving addition and subtraction. They will know their 2-12 times tables (group appropriate) using these to solve simple problems.

Topic:

Symmetry continued (Christmas symmetry)

 Pupils will know the 8 points of a compass and follow instructions involving these points (half turns, quarter turns etc.)

• Pupils will know that angles turn in multiples of 45 degrees (compass) and multiples of 30 degrees (clock).

English Pupils will:

- understand the use of speech marks and use them appropriately.
- understand the difference between direct and reported speech.
- know the key elements of a 'Recount' and be able to write one.
- recount 'The Nativity' story.

* Topic/World Around Us Pupils will:

- complete Space power points.
- know the planets in our system.
 - will know what a constellation is and be aware of the legends connected with them.

<u>Homework:</u> We encourage the P6s to keep doing AR reading as part of their daily homework. Each pupil should take at least one AR test per week (more if on green and orange level)

- AR Books can be changed in the library between 8.30 and 8.50.
- ICT suite is also available at these times to complete AR tests.

The P6 pupils will have a trip to the Armagh Planetarium in January. More information will follow.

Primary 7

Numeracy

- In Number we will be extending our understanding of place value. We will be working on problem solving tasks
- For topic work we will be covering co-ordinates
- Times tables from 1-12

Literacy

- Children will read and complete work on 'A Christmas Carol'
- Children will be begin looking at different types of poetry
