


P4 participated in a lovely 'Love for Life' session with Nathan and Sarah.











coding straight away whilst others needed a bit of help from those who were good. Some pupils actually got to see how the 3D printer makes the keychains and they thought it was really cool to see the layers. The temperature of the printer's nozzle was 200 degrees and the plate was 60 degrees so we couldn't touch it!"

Overview of planned work for February 2022

Primary 1

Topic: Toys

Role Play: The Toy Shop


Numeracy: Focus Number: 6 and 7. Children will be introduced to different ways of making 6 and 7.

◆ The story of 6 / 7:



1+5=6, 2+4=6, 3+3=6, 4+2=6, 5+1=6. 1+6=7, 2+5=7, 3+4=7, 4+3=7, 5+2=7, 6+1=7.

- Continue to count with your child up to 10/20/30/40/50.
- Using your number line help your child to find the number before/number after, the number next to, 1 more than and 1 less than. Using this language with your child is very important.





<u>**3D Shape**</u>: Recognise a cone. Look for cones when you are out and about e.g. traffic cones/an ice-cream cone.



<u>Literacy:</u> This month the children will learn the following sounds: <u>ai, j, oa, ie, ee</u> and <u>or</u>
They will listen to the story, song and learn the correct formation of each letter. Your child will receive the 3rd set of Jolly Phonics letters to add to their learning pack. Please continue to play

snap, pairs and build simple words together.

<u>Rhyming Words</u>: We are learning about words which rhyme. We are focusing on <u>at</u> and <u>an</u> words and <u>ig</u> and <u>in</u> words. e.g. Pig, Big, Wig / Fin, Bin, Win.

During story time with your child emphasise and point out words which rhyme to help your child hear these. You could play a game guessing which words rhymes with e.g. "hat"

<u>Letter Formation</u>: During homework activities please focus on using the correct formation of letters and numbers with your child. Correct formation information is at the front of the homework book.

<u>Word Book:</u> It is very important that you spend time each day reading and recognising these words. These are words which your child is coming across in their reading books.



<u>Musical Pathways:</u> The children are enjoying weekly music lessons with Mrs Grainne Kirk. During this time, we are learning to hear a steady beat in music and we are having opportunities to sing a variety of songs. The children are participating and responding very well. Early experiences in music have links to helping children focus and concentrate and in turn aid their progress in literacy and numeracy. Ask your

child to sing you some of the songs they have learnt.

Primary 2




Literacy: During the month of February our shared, guided and modelled reading and writing will focus around the topic of *'The Circus'*. Talk to your child about your own experiences of visiting the circus. How has the circus changed? What was your favourite act?

We are encouraging pupils to **recognise**, be able to **say the sounds** of and **correctly form** all letters covered to date from the Jolly Phonics programme. (*This can be accessed on YouTube by searching 'Jolly Phonics'*). Pupils will continue to use their phonic knowledge to sound out key words when writing simple sentences with **increasing** independence. It is very important that children are encouraged and supported with this both at home and in school.



Numeracy:



We will begin work on our **Money** topic. We will be encouraging the children to recognise 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, and £1 coins. We will be using coins within our play based learning to practise making and counting amounts of money up to 10p.

- We will continue to work on quick recall of number bonds within 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.
- We will continue counting in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's.

World Around Us / Learning through Play /Other Areas of Learning

Connected lessons linked to the topic 'The Circus' – clowns, tricks and circus acts.

Making clown masks, circus small world set, circus / clown jigsaws, circus acts keywords and sentence writing cards, circus stories, circus / clown paintings, practising tricks, etc.

Please note - we do not focus on circus animals during this topic.

Primary 3

Mathematics: Children will:

- continue to count in 1s, 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s up to 50 /100
- be familiar with the patterns which occur e.g. a quick way to 16 is by adding 10 and 6 more
- work on doubles and halves of number to 20
- continue to complete word problems relating to addition and subtraction
- continue to reinforce addition and subtraction number bonds to 20
- continue to work on addition of T.U. while bridging the 10 and subtraction of T.U.

Topic Work:

- Fractions halves and quarters of number and shapes
- Data handling related to recording of weather

Literacy: We will continue to look at some of the works of Jill Tomlinson, our class novel is her book The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark. Our writing genre for this month is procedural writing. This will be related to our W.A.U. topics of weather (e.g. how to make a windmill). Topical poetry related to weather and a study of poem The Owl and the Pussy Cat with related literacy lessons. Our Grammar focus is identifying verbs and adding ing/ed



The World Around Us: We will:

- continue our weather theme looking at ways to gather information and record the data (linked to numeracy)
- look at a map of Ireland locate places of interest e.g. cities, Enniskillen
- look at the history of great 'Science Inventors' and the 'Hot Air Balloon'

Primary 4

Literacy: Pupils will know that alliteration is the repetition of the same sound or letter at the beginning of each or most of the words in a sentence. They will use alliteration to make up newspaper article titles. Pupils will know what question words are and will look at when we use question marks. Pupils will continue to learn their spellings using the LSCWC method and will complete various activities to reinforce the spelling rule. Pupils will be reading their class novel 'Flat Stanley and the Great Egyptian Grave Robbery' and will be writing a newspaper report based on Stanley's adventure.

Numeracy: Pupils will continue to learn and apply multiplication facts. Our topic work this month will cover 2D shape where children will name 2D shapes and identify their properties. Pupils will know how to find the area of rectangles and squares. We will also be continually revising the times of o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to, minutes past and minutes to, days of the week and months of the year.

World Around Us: Our topic this term is 'Ancient Egypt'. We will continue researching Ancient Egypt to help us complete PowerPoints on computer. Pupils will be learning about the skeleton and the major organs of the body. They will be creating a holiday brochure for Egypt. Pupils will know how society was organised in Ancient Egypt and they will be learning all about Tutankhamun.



Primary 5

Numeracy

- Number: Division work using bus stop method, division with remainders. Word problems around the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Linking multiplying and dividing work.
- Topic: Measures (length and weight).
- Mental Maths Multiplying and dividing (weekly tables linked). Estimation of length and weight .

- Problem solving activities and word problems for division, length and weight.
- Weekly tables test preparation.

Literacy

- Novel: Continue work on 'Kaspar The Prince of Cats' and related activities from novel booklet. Tin foil art prints on 'Kaspar Prince of Cats'.
- Grammar work Apostrophes, possession showing ownership, contractions (cannot = can't).
- We will complete 'Schofield & Sims' spelling programme and activities linked to each week.
- Writing Start looking at different types of procedures and instructions. Tips for being safe on the Internet linked to Safer Internet Day.

World Around Us

- Topic work on Titanic Survivors of the Titanic, Morse Code and who was to blame for the sinking of the Titanic
- Independent research at home on the survivors and the music played when the ship was sinking

Other Information - Trips, Visits etc.

- Complete spelling revision <u>every night</u> (we will complete spelling work in class linked to weekly spellings).
 Spelling test on Friday morning in school.
- Accelerated reading will take place in class. The children can also complete reading at home and do a quiz in school on their level.
- Oxford Owl is still available to use. Username: ks2htps, Password: password2.

Primary 6

Maths: Number

- Pupils will complete 'subtraction' work.
- Pupils will know tables up to x 12.
- Pupils will know how to do short and long multiplication to 10,000.
- Pupils will solve word problems associated with multiplication.
- Pupils will understand the relationship between 'Multiplication' and 'Division'.

Topic

- Pupils will be become aware of measurement in its various forms.
- Pupils will be able to calculate perimeters of a range of shapes.
- Pupils will understand the term 'Area' and be able to work out the area of 2D shapes (regular and irregular) counting squares/formula (cm²).
- Pupils will know that the area of square/rectangle (LxB).
- Pupils will know area of a triangle is LxB divided by 2.

English

- Pupils will know how to use speech marks.
- Pupils will recognise a play and how it is structured.
- Pupils will design a comic strip and begin to write a short play script.
- Pupils will understand and know the correct punctuation and grammar needed to write a play script.
- Pupils will know how dialogue is set out and be able to use adverbs to qualify verbs in writing dialogue.

World Around Us

- Pupils will complete our space topic.
- Pupils will begin The Vikings topic and find out: Who the Vikings were? Where they came from? Why did they travel to new lands?
- Children are encouraged to visit their local library and take out books that may be relevant to our topic.

Homework

- Pupils will complete <u>SPELLINGS</u> daily at home. Learn and complete columns in spelling booklet on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Complete sentences or meanings on Monday night. Revise all tables on Thursday for Friday's test.
- Mental Arithmetic: Monday- complete part A and part B, Tuesday complete part C. Ensure key language is highlighted and corrections completed.
- Learn <u>TABLES</u> daily at home. (Topmark's 'Hit the Button is great fun programme for learning tables and pupils are familiar with it https://www.topmarks.co.uk/).
- Other short homework activities will be set occasionally.
- <u>READING:</u> Pupils are encouraged to read lots at home (own books and books from the school library at their AR level). Quizzes can be completed in school. Pupils are asked to complete one quiz per week minimum.

Primary 7

Numeracy

- This month in 'Number' we will be covering multiplication, division and fractions.
- For topic work we will be covering measures, scale and time.
- Continue to learn and revise times tables from 1-12.

Literacy

- In writing children will focus on 'Persuasive Writing' looking in particular at advertisements and writing letters.
- Pupils will complete grammar work on active and passive verbs as well as prefixes and suffixes.
- Pupils will continue reading 'The Twelfth Day of July' Novel. This is linked closely with our World Around Us topic Ireland/Northern Ireland.
- Pupils will complete associated work from the novel.

<u>World Around Us:</u> The topic this term is Ireland/Northern Ireland. Pupils will be learning the provinces and the counties of Ireland.

<u>ICT:</u> Safer INTERNET Day 2022 – 8th February 2022 – Pupils will complete a range of activities linked with this day throughout February.

PE:

- Pupils will have gymnastics on Wednesday
- Pupils will be participating in weekly swimming lessons this term
 Mr Starrs Thursday; Mrs McGurk Friday; Mrs Clarke Friday.

Music: Pupils will take part in Musical Pathway lessons every Thursday


HOMEWORK
