Healthy Me in P3 In P3 the children are learning about keeping healthy as part of their 'Healthy Me' topic. Each class carried out an experiment to look at the effect of having too much salt on our bodies and in food. The children also looked at different ways to be healthy. They children sorted foods on a target wheel into healthy and unhealthy categories. They also recorded what they ate in a day into a food diary and compared their healthy food choices.











Gardening in P4 Mr Starrs' class have been out working in the poly tunnel. They planted sprouting broccoli plants, a

blueberry bush and



rhubarb. The children also sowed spinach seeds and watered the other plants in the poly tunnel. Learning about the Famine in P7 In

WAU P7 pupils are learning about 'The Famine'. They have been investigating the effect of germs on potatoes with 'The Germy Potato' experiment. They left the potatoes in a dark cupboard over the weekend to see the outcome and just after a few days, the 'touched by unclean hands' potatoes were already starting to grow some 'furry bits'.

There were lots of groans at the sight of this, but happy faces that most of their hypotheses were correct.

The children have also planted potatoes in class as part of this topic. The will watch them grow over the next few months.

During the darker evenings please make sure your children are safe by reminding them to wear reflective clothing when they are out after dark.




## **Overviewed of Planned Work - October** Primary 1



Topic: Autumn/Little Red Riding Hood/Halloween

Literacy: Your child has started to complete homework activities including Jolly Phonics and Grow

in Love.





Say the Days of the Week and the Months of the Year with your child.



Shared Reading: The children have been introduced to the characters Kipper, Biff and Chip through shared reading lessons. At carpet time the children listen to a story from the 'Big Book' and answer questions relating to the story. Ask your child about the stories:

"At School" and "Getting Up".

**P.E.** Each Tuesday our coach takes a PE lesson with the children.

Remember: children need to wear trainers to school for P.E.

World Around Us: We are going on an Autumn walk to Forthill (more

details to follow). Talk to your child about the different colours of leaves, chestnuts, acorns and the changes in the weather during Autumn. The children will be listening to Autumn stories and learning songs about Autumn. Numeracy: Our focus number this month is number 2. "Half a heart will not do, straight line over makes a 2!" Shape: Our focus shape is the triangle. Have a go at making triangles at home, e.g., using twigs from the garden/lollipop sticks

Your child will receive a number line home this month. We would encourage you to spend time each day looking at the number line specifically focusing on recognising numbers 1 - 10. Ask your child to name the number before and after a given number.

- What number comes after 5?
- What number comes before 3?

Look for triangles when out and about with your child and discuss how many sides a triangle has.

Reminder of Library Days: Mrs McCann – Friday, Mrs McMenamin – Thursday, Mrs Colhoun – Wednesday Musical Pathways The children are enjoying weekly music lessons with Mrs Grainne Kirk. During this time the children are learning to hear a steady beat in music and have opportunities to sing a variety of songs. The children are participating and responding very well. Early experiences in music have links to helping children focus and concentrate and in turn aid their progress in literacy and numeracy. Ask your child to sing you some of the songs they have learnt.



Paths Programme PATHS (Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies) is a programme designed to facilitate the development of self-control, emotional awareness, peer relations and interpersonal problem solving skills. We are using this programme in P1. Each child will have the opportunity to be "Child of the Day" and will learn about giving one another a compliment.



#### Primary 2

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome our pupils and their parents/guardians to P2. Thank you for supporting your child as they settle into their new classroom. We are very proud of all the boys and girls.



#### Literacy

We have now worked through the sounds s, a, t, i, p, n, c, k, e and h (including their capitals forms) to date. It is vital that your child is able to correctly form, recognise and sound these out (including their capital form). Please revise these daily with your child, referring to the 'Language of Writing' in your child's home link book.

Over the next month we will be forming, recognising and sounding out r R, m M, d D, g G, o O and u U.

## **Mental Maths to practise**

- Count forwards in 1s to 30 and backwards from 20 to 0.
- Order numbers to 14, ask questions like "What comes after 10?"
- We have been using a number line in school to practise numbers before, after and in between within 20 e.g. What number comes after 11? What number comes before 8? What number is in between 13 and 15? Practise adding 1 to a given number within 10 mentally e.g. 7 + 1 =, use counters to support thinking if needed.



- Practise recognition of the digits 11-20.
- Practise writing the numbers 0-20 correctly in order.



**World Around Us:** Our topic this month is 'Houses and Homes'. We will be finding out about houses and homes in our local area and how they are similar/different to houses and homes around the world. We will learn how houses are built and what materials are used. Please talk to your child about this. We look forward to hearing what the children find out.



#### **Other Notes:**

As the weather is getting colder we ask that all children bring a <u>warm coat</u> to school each day. It is
important that your child is able to put on their own coat. <u>Please encourage your child to practise</u>
this.



- **PE is on Monday for all P2 classes; our coach is Callum.** PE uniform can be worn to school on the days your child has PE. This is a yellow Holy Trinity PE t-shirt, navy/grey tracksuit bottoms or blue PE shorts, school jumper and trainers.
- <u>Snack/Lunch</u>: Can we remind parents/carers that we are encouraging children to bring a healthy snack to school each day e.g. a piece of fruit, yogurt, crackers, etc and a healthy lunch. Treats should be kept to a minimum. <u>No</u> items containing nuts are allowed in school.
- **Uniform**: Please ensure your child's uniform is clearly labelled with their full name in order to minimise incidents of lost property.

#### **Primary 3**

#### Literacy

#### Grammar

- Children will learn what a verb is (doing word)
- Children will learn what an adjective is (describing word)
- Correct formation of lower and uppercase letters

Writing: Instructional writing. How to write instructions for various topics and understanding the steps needed e.g.

- What I need for a good night's sleep
- Steps I need to brush my teeth

#### **Spelling**

- Children will complete spellings each night (Mon Wed)
- Use the look, say, cover, write, check method for Friday test

#### **Numeracy:** *Number*

- Addition up to 20/30
- Subtraction up to 20/find difference between numbers
- Missing box number sums
- Place value to 99

#### **Mental Maths**

- Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s to 50 or 100
- Number bonds to 10, doubles of numbers

#### **Topic Maths:** *Measures*

- Language of 'length' units of measurement, non-arbitrary units, cm, m
- Practical measuring inside and outside

#### **World Around Us:**

- Continued work on 'Healthy Me' topic
- Focus on what is needed for a good sleep, what to do before bedtime to switch off, how we take care of our body e.g. shower, rest, brush teeth, exercise

#### Homework:

- Literacy & Numeracy Given on a Monday and to be handed in on a Thursday
- Religion 'Grow In Love' Programme Given on a Wednesday and to be handed in on a Friday
- Spelling revision completed every night
- Mathletics tasks set on a Monday and completed for Thursday

#### Other:

- Please send a coat with your child to school every day as we walk in Forthill and are outside at break and dinner times.
- Please label all jumpers/cardigans/coats etc. clearly.

- Healthy snacks to be eaten at break time only and treats to a minimum at dinner time
- PE: Mrs Mc Manus -Tue & Fri, Miss Hoy -Tue & Fri, Mrs Kelly Wed & Fri.

Note: School PE kit to be worn on PE day (navy shorts/leggings, yellow P.E t-shirt and trainers).

#### Primary 4

<u>Literacy-</u> Pupils will learn what an adjective is. They will look at punctuation with a particular focus on when we use capital letters. Classes will continue to read 'Little Manfred' by Michael Morpurgo together and they will complete selected activities on the novel. The writing covered this month will focus on letter writing. This will be linked to their WW2 topic and they will be pretending to be evacuees writing home. Pupils will complete comprehension activities weekly and will learn to answer in full sentences making reference to the question in their answers.

Literacy homework includes reading their Accelerated Reading book in preparation for doing a quiz in school.

<u>Numeracy:</u> Pupils will take part in mental maths lessons to help them calculate answers mentally. This month the focus will be on place value, partitioning of numbers and using the vertical method for addition, progressing to bridging/carrying. Pupils will learn to understand and use the language associated with these areas. We will also continue to practise solving simple addition word problems.

Daily revision of names of 2D/3D shapes, days of week, months of year and time-o'clock, quarter past/to, half past times. Topic work will focus on length, measuring, using the correct units e.g. cm, km and understanding perimeter. Mathletics tasks are set for completion as part of homework. Sign in details can be found in your child's homework diary.

<u>World Around Us</u>: Pupils will continue to learn about World War 2 including rationing, daily life in WW2, evacuees and the blitz. They will create a collage of a Blitz City Scene and also produce their version of Van Gogh's painting The Road to Tarascon using pastels. They will look at transparent, translucent and opaque in connection with the use of 'blackout' materials during WW2.

Other Information: We will continue our Shared Education activities with Jones Memorial PS.

Please check your child's homework diary to support them in ensuring they have completed all homework.

#### **Primary 5**

#### **Numeracy**

- Number: Addition and subtraction of Hundreds, Tens and Units, problem solving activities (online games, table top games and worksheets)
- Topic: Properties of 2D shapes (square, triangle, rectangle, circle) & 3D shapes (cube, cuboid, cylinder, sphere, cone), symmetry (mirror images), lines (horizontal, vertical, diagonal and parallel)
- Mental Maths revision of times tables, use of Mathletics computer programme at least once a week for homework.
- Weekly tables test preparation whiteboard work.
- Encourage use of everyday Maths e.g. shapes, time and money to enable children to see Maths in day to day context.

#### Literacy

- Novel: Charlotte's Web and related activities
- Grammar work Verbs (doing words), Adjectives (describing words) and begin Adverbs (describing a verb).
- We will complete Schofield & Sims Spelling Programme (meanings, sentences, endings and workbook) to prepare the children for their Friday test.
- Writing Poetry Haiku's and noun and verb ending poems (link with Mini-beast topic and Halloween) and acrostic poems.

#### **World Around Us**

- Continued topic work on minibeasts instructions for wormery
- Facts on insects and carry out activities on the spider
- Mini-beast hunt

## Other Information

- Complete spelling revision <u>every night</u>. We will complete spelling work in class linked to weekly spellings. Spelling test on Friday morning in school
- Accelerated reading will take place in class. The children can also complete reading at home and do a quiz in school at their level.
- Guided Reading newsletter sent out for parents to read/view on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> October.

- Weekly Irish classes every Thursday, children to practice some common phrases, numbers in Irish etc every Wednesday night for approximately 10 mins.
- Shared Education trips with Jones Memorial Primary School to take place during the school day at Jones Memorial PS on 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of October 2022.

#### **Primary 6**

#### **PDMU**

- Pupils will develop their self-esteem.
- They will be able to recognise various feelings, reactions, points of view of self and others.

#### **Maths Number**

Complete 'Place Value' (continued from September)

#### Pupils will be able to:

- Add and subtract using a variety of mental strategies.
- Add and subtract using standard written methods.
- Solve problems involving addition and subtraction. (Maths Games/Izak 9)
- Use the relationship between addition and subtraction to check calculations.
- Understand and <u>underline</u> the key words when solving problems using addition and subtraction. (esp. in Mental arithmetic books)

#### **Maths Topic**

- Complete 'Time' (continued from September)
- 2D shapes.
- Pupils will understand terms of line- horizontal, vertical, diagonal, parallel and perpendicular.
- Pupils will know language associated with measuring a circle. They will be able to find the diameter, circumference and radius.

#### Literacy

- Children will understand term 'nouns' (Common, proper, collective and plural nouns).
- Children will understand term 'verbs' and recognise them (doing/being words).
- Children will be able to form verbs in the past, present and future tense.
- Pupils will understand story structure to plan and write a story, drawing on personal experiences [narrative].
- Novel the children will listen to and respond to our class Novel "Wonder."

#### **Topic/World Around Us (SPACE)**

#### Pupil will learn:

- How shadows are formed and changed.
- Know the earth travels around the sun and it takes a year to orbit the sun.
- Know that the earth's surface spins into the sun's light we have daylight and when it spins away from the sun's light we have darkness.

## Homework

- Pupils will complete <u>SPELLINGS</u> daily at home. Learn and complete columns on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in spelling booklet. Complete sentences or meanings on Monday night. Revise all tables on Thursday for Friday's test.
- <u>MENTAL ARITHMETIC</u> Complete part A and B on Tuesday, complete corrections and part C on Wednesday. ALL pupils must *highlight* the key part to each question.
- Learn <u>TABLES</u> daily at home. (Topmarks 'Hit the Button' is great fun programme for doing this and pupils are familiar with this programme).
- Other short homework activities will be set occasionally.
- <u>READING:</u> Pupils are encouraged to read lots at home. (own books and books from school library at their AR level) Quizzes can be completed in school. Pupils are asked to complete one quiz per week minimum. Reading books will be sent home this month. Please check what reading your child has to do every night alongside their AR Reading.

#### Primary 7

#### Literacy

- Pupils will continue to read the novel 'Twist of Gold' by Michael Morpurgo and complete associated activities from their novel booklet.
- Pupils will complete a variety of listening and written comprehensions

- Through creative writing we will look at biographies and autobiographies from a range of people and complete work on these.
- Pupils will complete grammar work on verbs including adverbs, verb tenses, regular and irregular and active and passive verbs
- We will complete Schofield & Sims Spelling Programme (meanings, sentences, endings and workbook) to prepare the children for their Friday test
- Guided reading will take place in class. The children can also complete reading at home and do an AR quiz in school on their level

## Maths

- Number: Multiplication and Division Pupils will continue their work on long multiplication and problem-solving questions and then move on to division strategies. We will also begin to look at fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Topic We will be looking at Shape and Space. 2D and 3D shapes and their properties, symmetry and the various different types of lines
- Mental Maths Revision of times tables

#### World Around Us - The Irish Famine

- This month we look at potatoes and the effects they had on the Famine. We will be planting potatoes in class as well as doing experiments on how bacteria/germs can affect the potato.
- Pupils will be going on a trip linked to this topic later in the term once the new workhouse is completed at the start of December.

**PE** – Pupils attend swimming lessons weekly.

Music- Pupils take part in Musical Pathways every Thursday
