They have been learning about snow and ice, painting snowmen as well as looking at ice cubes and how they change when they melt.

children are enjoying role play in the space stations, building space jigsaws, space topic keywords and sentence writing, space station small world play

sets, space play dough, space themed sand play, space stories, space themed arts and crafts, moon rock counting, alien adventure maze, space bingo and so much more! different ways of representing 2-digit numbers.




3D Printing in P4 As part of their Egyptians topic P4 classes are designing their own Egyptian cartouches with hieroglyphics, a form of

## Primary 2

## Topic: Space

**Literacy:** This month we will be focus our shared, guided and modelled reading and writing around the topic of **Space**. Talk to your child about what they are learning about the topic and encourage them to research facts about space at home using books, toys, the internet or visiting the local library.





Pupils will <u>recognise</u>, be able to say the <u>sounds</u> of and correctly <u>form</u> the letters s, a, t, i, p, n, c, k, e, h, r, m,

d, g, o, u, l, f, b, j, z, w, v, y, x and the digraphs ai, oa, ie, ee, or, ng and oo from the Jolly Phonics programme (upper and lower case, including the 'action'). This can be accessed at home on YouTube by searching 'Jolly prics'.

## Phonics'.

Pupils will continue to practise writing simple sentences with **some** independence. Please continue to encourage and support your child with this at home.

**Numeracy:** This month we will be focusing on the topics of addition and time. Pupils will be adding using a number line. We will focus on ordinal numbers  $1^{st} - 10^{th}$ . With the use of a number line add 2 and 3



Pupils will learn o'clock and half past times. Encourage your child to read o'clock and half past times on the clock at home.

## World Around Us/Learning through Play/Other Areas of Learning

Connected lessons within the topic of **Space**.

Learning through play will link to the topic of Space – making jet packs, space station small world set, space jigsaws, space play dough, solar system keywords and sentence writing cards, alien and spaceship paintings, etc.

## Primary 3

## Literacy: Grammar

- Children will know what plurals are
- Children will change singular words into plural words change endings (s, es) Writing: Recount
- Activities linked to the novel 'The Penguin Who Wanted To Find Out...'
- Retell and sequence important events from the story
- Look at ways the penguin looks after the smaller penguins and link it to their own experiences
- Writing on the Arctic, Antarctic and polar animals

## Primary 4

**Literacy**: Pupils will know that comparative adjectives are used to compare **two** things usually by adding the suffix er. Pupils will continue to learn their spellings using the LSCWC method and will complete various activities to reinforce the spelling rule. Pupils will be reading their class novel 'Flat Stanley and the Great Egyptian Grave Robbery' and will be carrying out activities based on this. In writing, pupils will be learning about instructions and will be writing instructions for mummification linked to their WAU topic.

**Numeracy**: Pupils will be learning about subtraction using decomposition (borrowing & carrying). They will continue to learn multiplication facts. Pupils will solve subtraction word problems. Our topic work this month will cover handling data where pupils will use tally charts, record information on bar graphs and interpret and read pictograms. **World Around Us**: Our topic this term will be Ancient Egypt. Pupils will be able to locate Egypt on a map and will be able to name the 7 continents. Pupils will learn about the features of rivers and learn about the importance of the River Nile. They will look at what has survived in Egypt today and they will learn about mummification. Pupils will design a fair test to mummify an orange. In art, pupils will look at self-portraits and complete their own. We will be researching Ancient Egypt to help us complete PowerPoints on the computer and design their own Egyptian Cartouches for printing on the 3D printer.

## Primary 5

## Numeracy: Number

- Pupils will be able to understand language of multiplication
- Pupils will be able to recognise multiplication facts up to 10 (class work will vary depending on ability)
- Pupils will be able to multiply by 10 and 100 (know rule)
- Pupils will be able to multiply a two and three-digit number with a single digit
- Topic: Pupils will recognise, name and order the days of the week and months of the year
- Pupils will be able to read and interpret a simple calendar
- Pupils will be able to tell the time in analogue format
- Language of time from National Teaching Strategy book
- Use of clocks for practical work o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to times

## Language and Literacy:

Spelling/Phonics: Weekly spelling sessions

Reading (Guided, Shared, Modelled):

- Pupils will be able to skim and scan passages for a range of compound words, homophones and synonyms (Vocabulary Victor)
- Pupils will discuss why the author used a certain synonym. (Arlo the Author)
- Grammar and punctuation

- Pupils will know what a compound word is
- Pupils will be able to recognise words with a same sound, different meaning
- Pupils will be able to know what a synonym is
- Pupils will be able to know what an antonym is
- Novel work: 'Kasper the Prince of Cats' and related activities.

## Writing:

- Pupils will recognise the important features of a diary entry/extract
- Pupils will recognise past and present tense within a diary entry
- Pupils will begin to recognise the main idea in paragraphs
- Pupils will consider, interpret and discuss a range of diary accounts, exploring the ways in which language can be manipulated in order to affect the reader or engage attention.

#### World Around Us/STEM:

- Pupils will know the various countries both local and global associated with the making and sailing of the Titanic.
   (P) Research using ipads and map work
- Pupils will know that the Titanic was built in Belfast.
- Pupils will be aware of the conditions the Titanic encountered on the journey, Weather conditions, Morse code, safety procedures.

## Other information, trips, visits:

- Complete spelling revision each night (we will complete spelling work in class linked to the weekly spellings) Spelling test Friday.
- Accelerated reading will take place in class. The children can also complete reading at home and do a quiz in school on their level.

#### **Primary 6**

#### <u>Maths</u>

Number: Pupils will

- know tables up to x12
- know how to do short and long multiplication to 10,000
- solve word problems associated with Multiplication
- understand the relationship between Multiplication and Division

## Topic:

- Investigate practically quarter turns, half turns and whole turns to understand the notion of angle in the context of turning
- Know the 8 points of a compass and that angles turn in multiples of 45 degrees (compass) 30 degrees(clock).
- Follow instructions incorporating 8 points of the compass and relate to ¼ turn, ½ turns and ¾ of a turn.
- Pupils will be able to calculate the inside angles of triangles and quadrilaterals.
- Pupils will be become aware of measurement in its various forms
- Pupils will be able to calculate perimeters of a range of shapes
- Pupils will understand the term 'Area' and be able to work out area of 2D shapes (regular and irregular) counting squares/ formula (cm2)
- Pupils will know that the area of square/rectangle is (LxB)
- Pupils will know area of a triangle is LxB divided by 2.

## English Pupils will:

- know how to use speech marks
- recognise a play and how it is structured
- design a comic strip and begin to write a short play script
- understand and know the correct punctuation and grammar needed to write a play script.
- know how dialogue is set out and be able to use adverbs to qualify verbs in writing dialogue.

#### World Around Us: Pupils will

• complete our space topic.

• begin 'The Vikings' topic and find out: Who the Vikings were? Where they came from? Why did they travel to new lands?

*Children are encouraged to visit their local library and take out books that may be relevant to our topic* <u>Homework</u>

- Pupils will complete <u>SPELLINGS</u> daily at home. Learn and complete columns in spelling booklet on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Complete sentences or meanings on Monday night. Revise all tables on Thursday for Friday's test.
- Mental Arithmetic: Part A and Part B Tuesday and Part C Wednesday. Ensure key language is highlighted and corrections completed.
- Learn <u>TABLES</u> daily at home. (Topmark's 'Hit the Button' is great fun programme for doing this and pupils are familiar with this programme).
- Other short homework activities will be set occasionally.
- <u>READING</u>: Pupils are encouraged to read lots at home. (own books and books from school library at their AR level) Quizzes can be completed in school. Pupils are asked to complete one quiz per week minimum and reach their personal word target.

A trip to Armagh Planetarium is booked for Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> March as a conclusion to P6's 'Space' topic. Further details/cost etc will be given out closer to this date.

#### Primary 7

#### Numeracy:

- This term in number, we will be covering number multiples, products, square numbers, triangular numbers.
- For topic work we will be covering Measures looking at length, weight, conversions and imperial units.
- Division tables from 1-12.

#### Literacy:

- In writing children will focus on different types of poetry and create their own poems.
- Children will complete grammar work linked closely to their poetry including metaphors, similes, personification.
- Novel Book 12<sup>th</sup> Day of July Linked to our topic work, this novel is based in 1970s Belfast.

## World Around Us:

- The Topic this term is Ireland/Northern Ireland.
- Pupils will be creating 3D models at home of their chosen Irish/Northern Irish landmark.

#### <u>PE:</u>

- Children will be participating in weekly hurling lessons with a coach.
- Pupils will also take part in Gymnastics with their class teacher following the Core NI lessons.
- Confirmation is on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2023 in St Michael's Parish Church. (Time is to be confirmed).
