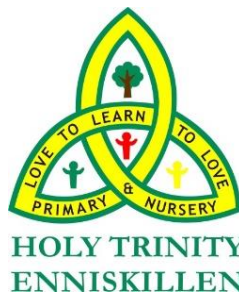

Northern Ireland Resources Network (NIRN) Reuse and Repair Competition 2026 Winners.

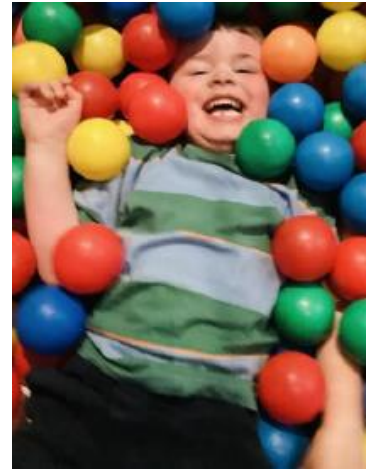
